Basic Home Emergency Kits Include

- ✓ Water- 1gallon per day per person
- ✓ Food- 3 day supply of non-perishable food (dried fruit, meat, or canned items)
- ✓ Battery or hand powered NOAA Weather Radio
- ✓ Flashlights and extra batteries
- ✓ Local Maps
- ✓ First Aid Kit
- ✓ Signal Whistle
- ✓ Dust mask or cotton t-shirt to filter air
- ✓ Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ✓ Plastic sheeting and duct tape
- Moist towelettes and trash bags (for hygiene and sanitation)

You May Also Need

- ✓ Infant formula and diapers
- ✓ Cell phone and charger
- ✓ Cash or traveler's checks
- ✓ Medication (a week supply)
- ✓ Eye glasses, hearing aid batteries
- ✓ Wheelchair batteries
- Oxygen
- Pet food



- ✓ Deeds


